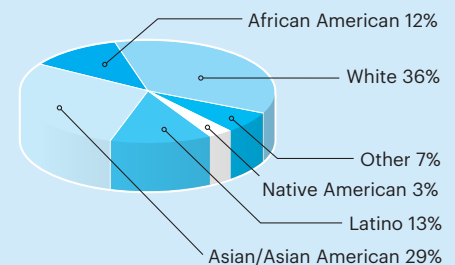

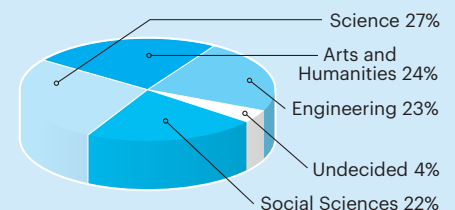

Category of possible 1st choice major

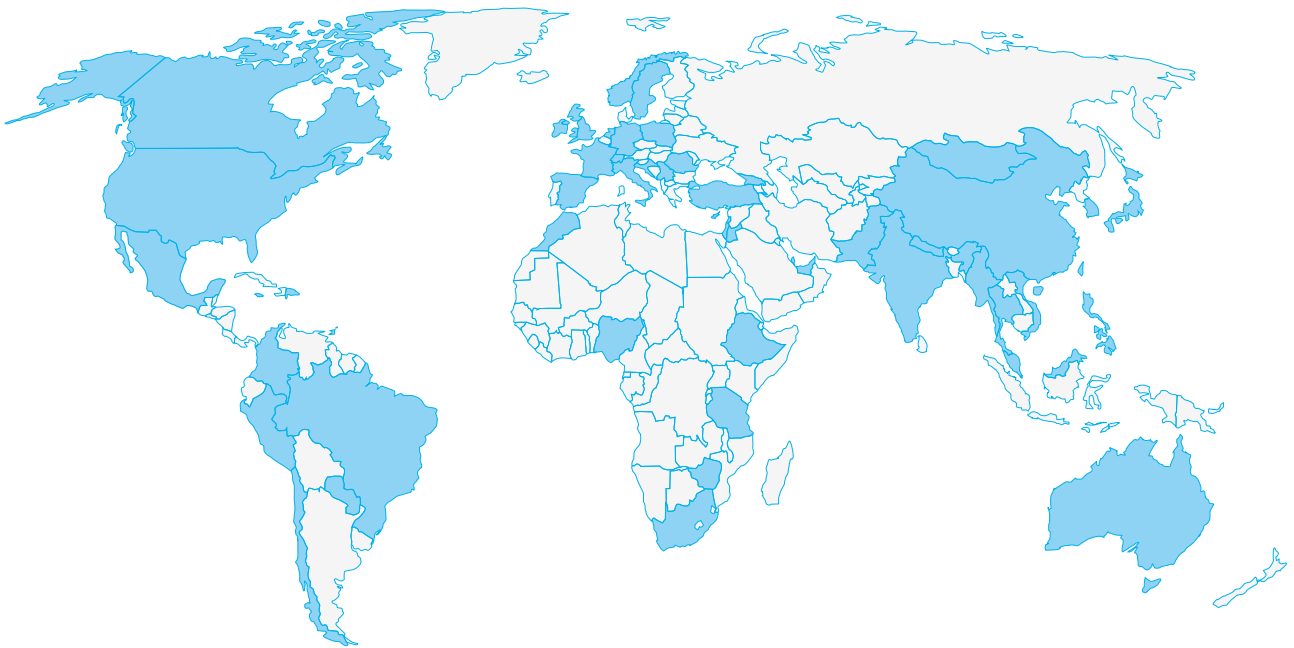


Around the World with the Class of 2015
